

1 Respective responsibilities of the auditor and the authority

Our responsibility as auditors to complete a **limited assurance review** is set out by the National Audit Office (NAO). A limited assurance review is **not a full statutory audit**, it does not constitute an audit carried out in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (UK & Ireland) and hence it **does not** provide the same level of assurance that such an audit would. The UK Government has determined that a lower level of assurance than that provided by a full statutory audit is appropriate for those local public bodies with the lowest levels of spending.

Under a limited assurance review, the auditor is responsible for reviewing Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return in accordance with NAO Auditor Guidance Note 02 (AGN 02) as issued by the NAO on behalf of the Comptroller and Auditor General. AGN 02 is available from the NAO website – https://www.nao.org.uk/code-audit-practice/guidance-and-information-for-auditors/

This authority is responsible for ensuring that its financial management is adequate and effective and that it has a sound system of internal control. The authority prepares an Annual Governance and Accountability Return in accordance with *Proper Practices* which:

- summarises the accounting records for the year ended 31 March 2025; and
- confirms and provides assurance on those matters that are relevant to our duties and responsibilities as external auditors.

2 External auditor's limited assurance opinion 2024/25

Except for the matters reported below, on the basis of our review of Sections 1 and 2 of the Annual Governance and Accountability Return (AGAR), in our opinion the information in Sections 1 and 2 of the AGAR is in accordance with Proper Practices and no other matters have come to our attention giving cause for concern that relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have not been met.

Section 1, Assertion 5 has been incorrectly completed. Information received from the smaller authority highlights that risk management arrangements were not reviewed and approved by the authority as a whole during the year. As a result, this assertion should have been answered 'No'. This is consistent with the Internal Auditor's response to Internal Control Objective C.

Section 1, Assertion 2 has been incorrectly completed, as the authority did not approve payments schedules including salaries during 2024/25. This is consistent with the Internal Auditor's response to Internal Control Objectives B and G.

In addition to the reasons given for non-compliance with Assertion 2 above, the smaller authority has restated its fixed assets to zero for both the current and prior year. This is due to uncertainty around the ownership of certain assets and the authority is currently working to produce an accurate fixed asset register. The authority should ensure that the corrected values for fixed assets are included in Box 9 of the 2025/26 AGAR for both 2025/26 and 2024/25.

Other matters not	t affecting o	ur opinion wh	ich we draw	to the a	ttention of	the authority:

The smaller authority has confirmed that it has not complied with the governance Assertions in Section 1, Boxes 4 and 7, but it has provided the appointed auditor with an adequate explanation for non-compliance and details of the actions necessary to address weaknesses identified. This is consistent with the internal auditor's response to ICO M.
